

By rebuilding five hundred metres of track between two halves of the Great Central Railway, we can create an eighteen mile heritage line, complete with connection to the main line.

This is no impossible dream. 3 parts of the project are ready for track and there's £1.9m raised and ready to spend on the next sections.

# REUNIFICATION The adventure gathers speed!

We're making great progress on our Reunification project - reconnecting two halves the former Great Central Railway Main Line. We know everyone wants to see the whole job completed, but we can only go as fast as our funding allows.

Reconnecting the railways is a long term ambition but it's also essential for the entire GCR to thrive in the future. We'll be able to share locomotives, rolling stock, volunteers and engineering resources.

Charter trains and visiting locomotives will be able to arrive via the main line connection.

Together the railway's are greater than the sum of their parts. They can offer every possible facility to commercial businesses that want to use the GCR for testing, training or filming.

It will be a premier heritage railway, connecting local communities and attractions, promoting sustainable tourism in the East Midlands.

Together we are making what was called impossible happen. We want to get building again as soon as we can and that means getting all the right paperwork in place first. Your support is essential so we hope you'll consider a donation.

# It's happening!

Reunifying the two railways means rebuilding railway taken away after the Great Central was originally closed in the 1960s. We've split the project into seven phases. Once written off as an 'impossible pipe dream' three are now complete and 'track ready!'

The first to be finished was a new multi-million pound bridge across the Midland Main Line. It will carry heritage trains above the national rail network and is sure to be a well-photographed spot!

The bridge was funded by your donations and a grant from the Leicester and Leicestershire Enterprise Partnership and now stands ready to serve. Getting it in place now has 'unlocked' the rest of the Reunification project.

Most of the project requires new infrastructure but we're also caring for our heritage when it can be reused.






An original, elegant Great Central bridge across the Grand Union Canal has been completely refurbished. This unlikely survivor was built in 1897 and last carried a train more than fifty years ago. Both bridge decks have been restored ready to carry trains again. Soon passengers will be able to wave at pleasure boaters below.

In 2022 the condition of another original GCR bridge - the one which crosses the A60 road - began to cause concern, so it was moved up the 'to-do' list. It wasn't possible to economically repair this structure, so it was replaced with a brand new one. Again, it will carry two tracks and is key to connecting the two halves of the GCR together and linking them to the main line.



More than four million pounds have been invested in the project so far. It's attracted the support of stakeholders and the community in the East Midlands and progress is being keenly watched around the world. We want to push forward as quickly as funds allow.

We really hope you'll consider a regular small donation once a month which will unlock more progress.




### What's next?

The next two sections we want to build involves crossing a factory car park on a short viaduct and then a road called 'Railway Terrace'. It's another 61 metres of railway and will connect the new main line bridge to the main section of embankment we need to rebuild.

We've already had pre-planning application discussions with our local authority and prepared designs.

With your generosity, we completed the recent work on the A60 bridge without dipping into our funds for these two pieces of the jigsaw. Even better after a successful fundraising drive we now have close to £2 million ready to spend, around two-thirds of what we need to get going again.





#### Our plan is in three stages.


First, invest in obtaining planning consent.


Second, continue fundraising.

And finally begin construction of the Factory Flyover section when funds allow.

We want to get building again for two reasons. First, it locks the money you've raised into concrete and metal and protects it from inflation. Just as important though is it demonstrates forward progress and keeps us all focussed on the goal - the Greater Great Central Railway.

How far we can get with these two sections depends entirely on your support.





# Your donations

# David Clarke Railway Trust

DCRT is the official supporting charity of the Great Central Railway and managing the project funds. It's run on voluntary basis which means well over 99% of every pound given is spent as you intend - DCRTs costs being kept to a bare minimum.

As a charity, it can claim gift aid on your donations. Gift aid is a government scheme that adds another 25% to your donation at no extra cost to you! Give £20 and it becomes £25 with gift aid.

When you donate to Reunification please make the gift aid declaration if you can by ticking the box.

DCRT also receives bequests for the project. We'd always recommend talking to your solicitor about a will or specific gift to David Clarke Railway Trust but we hope you will consider us when making arrangements. Your passion can live on to inspire another generation.
