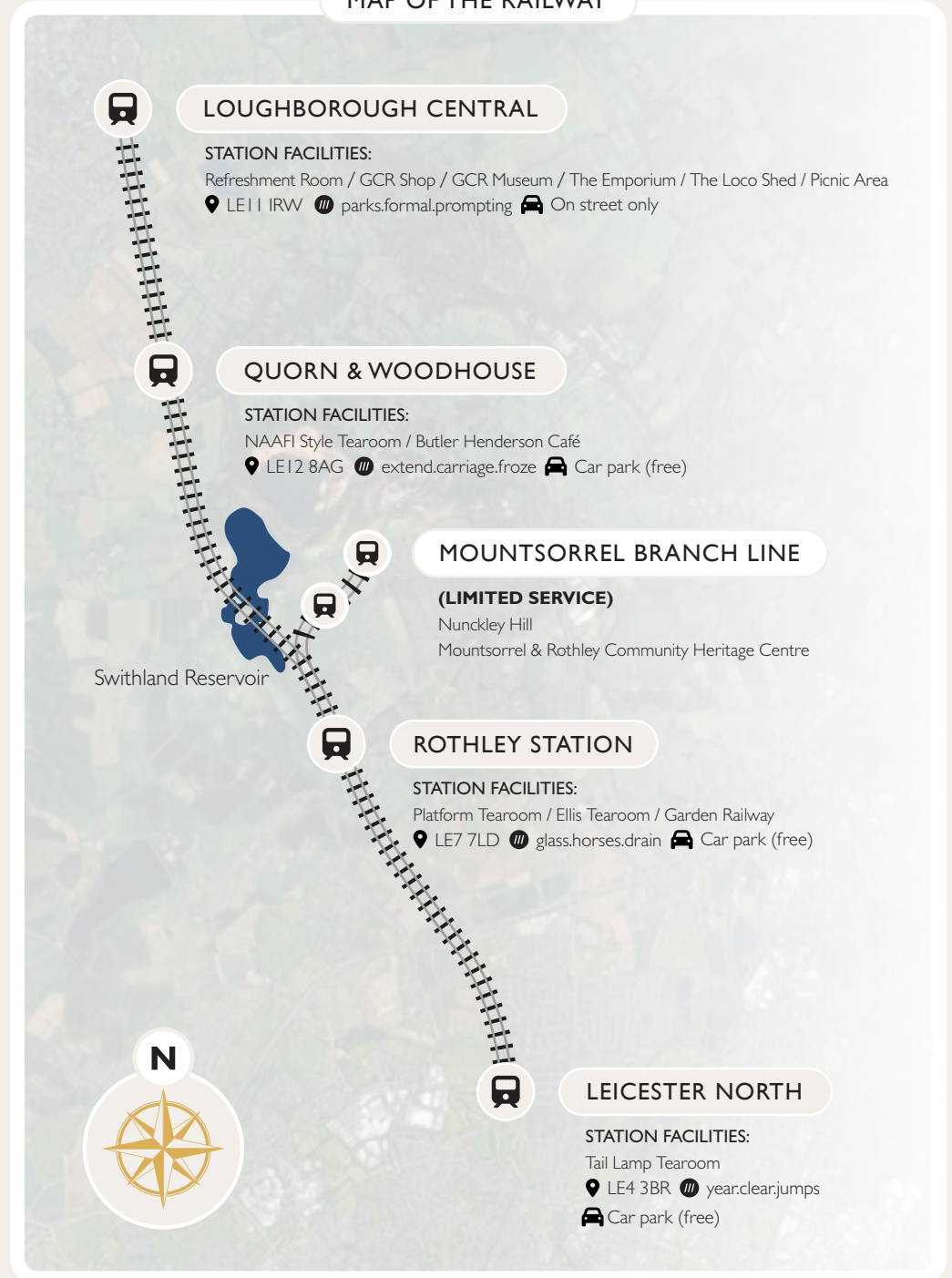

YOUR SAFETY FIRST

STAY SAFE DURING YOUR VISIT

To open the carriage door from the platform, grab the carriage handle and turn it so it is vertical, then pull the door towards you.

To close the door once you are on board pull the door towards you by holding the interior window ledge. Make sure your fingers are not in the way and that no one else is trying to get on behind you.

To open a carriage door on arrival at a station platform, pull the window down. Put your arm out and turn the exterior handle to the vertical position again. You may have to push against the door. **DO NOT** open the door if the train is moving or is not at a platform.

When you arrive at the station platform take note of the gap between the train and platform. Some stations may have a drop which requires a step to be used. Ask staff for assistance if you require it or are unsure. Steps are provided throughout the train. If you cannot see one, ask staff to get you one.

PLEASE REMEMBER THE FOLLOWING

If you require assistance to get on or off the train, please ask

Please be extra careful with children or if you have limited mobility

Adults should alight first to assist children getting off

Be aware of rough underfoot conditions in some areas on the railway

DO NOT attempt to board or alight from a moving train

DO NOT put any body parts (including your head) out of a window or door when the train is moving

REFRESHMENTS ON THE LINE



LOUGHBOROUGH CENTRAL

Our lovingly restored 1950s railway Refreshment Room is a wonderful location to take a break and watch the trains come and go. It is open when trains are running. It serves hot and cold snacks, refreshments and is licenced. It is situated on the platform. In addition, at the end of the platform is a small picnic area where you can watch the trains pass.

QUORN & WOODHOUSE

The NAAFI (The Navy, Army, and Air Force Institute) is a small tea room and snack bar situated on Platform 2. It is presented in an atmospheric 1940s condition. It is open on most operating days. The Butler Henderson Café is adjacent to the station and car park and boasts an outside terrace embankment overlooking the lovingly restored station and allows for great views of the locomotives passing by. There's also the station yard's much loved Tin Shed Bar that's open on special events, offering an excellent range of cask ales and ciders; also, tea, coffee, soft drinks and light refreshments to keep you going throughout the day.



ROTHLEY STATION

On the platform, the station Tea Room is a wonderful small gas lit tea room, serving light refreshments on days when trains are running. If you fancy something more substantial, then try Ellis Tea Room adjacent to Rothley station. This is our traditional setting Tea Room, set in Edwardian surroundings and has a beautiful outside seating area from which to watch our famed trains, whilst enjoying Afternoon Tea during the warmer months.

LEICESTER NORTH

The Tail Lamp Tea Room at Leicester North station is open on most weekends. Located in the station building, you can purchase tea and coffee, snacks and cakes while waiting for your next train towards Loughborough.
